

- 4. The ballot includes a Constitutional Amendment to increase the size of the Board to allow the third Technical Region Director to have a vote at the table.
- 5. Information on the Nominees can be found on the <u>electronic ballot</u> or the ASCE <u>election pages</u>.
- 6. Students and Affiliate Members are not eligible to vote.
- 7. Dues must have been paid by April 1, 2017 to be eligible to vote.
- 8. The election will close at 5:00pm Central Daylight Time on June 1, 2017.

Support the National Student Steel Bridge Competition at OSU on May 26, 2017

Oregon State University and the OSU School of Civil and Construction Engineering are excited to host the 2017 National Student Steel Bridge Competition (NSSBC) this Memorial Day weekend, May 26 and 27. We would love your help in reaching our goal of \$35,000 in order to make this incredible experience possible, while keeping participant fees low.

At the NSSBC, approximately 50 student teams and over 500 students from universities all over the world construct and test bridges which they have designed and fabricated to meet a detailed set of specifications. The Steel Bridge teams compete to be the best in aesthetics, lightness, stiffness, construction speed, construction economy, and structural efficiency. The bridges need to support 2500 pounds and be erected in a timed construction event with another set of detailed constraints. If it is possible for you to donate, your gift can help to:

- Cover costs of competition materials and equipment
- Keep student registration fees as low as possible
- Cover costs of venues, parking, and food for our participants, judges, and volunteers. We have been fortunate to have a great turnout of professionals to serve as judges on Saturday.

Environmental and Water Resources Institute's 2017 Arid Lands Hydraulic Engineering Award Winner: Dr. Jeffery B. Bradley, Ph.D, D.WRE

Dr. Jeffrey B. Bradley, Ph.D., P.E., D.WRE, President and CEO of WEST Consultants, has been awarded the **Environmental and Water Resources Institute's 2017 Arid Lands Hydraulic Engineering Award**. The EWRI award committee's selection was based upon Dr. Bradley's engineering solutions provided in the arid U.S. and

his "significant contributions during a stellar 40-year career in the areas of hydraulics, hydrology and sedimentation, especially involving debris flow effects on alluvial fan flooding and bridge scour." This annual award, established first in 1986, is particularly focused on noteworthy contributions especially applicable to arid or semi-arid climates. Dr. Bradley was a founding member of the EWRI Board of Directors and EWRI 2002 President. He was also a founding President of AAWRE. Dr. Bradley will be receiving his award at the EWRI Watershed Council Awards Luncheon on Wednesday, May 24th at the Congress in Sacramento, CA.
