# LTC Fall Meeting Recap

Incoming, current, and outgoing members of the Leader Training Committee met prior to the 2024 Presidents and Governors Forum (PGF) and Leader Orientation at ASCE Headquarters in Reston Virginia

The meeting focused on planning for the next term year, while also leaving time to brainstorm ways LTC can grow and improve. We were fortunate to be joined by several members of the **Committee on Geographic Units** (**CGU**), who also took the opportunity to develop their plans for the year.

With assignments made, the committees also discussed logistics for the combined PGF and Leader Orientation—more on that on the next page—and looked ahead to the Multi-Region Leadership Conferences (MRLCs).

Finally, LTC asked ASCE's Executive Director Tom Smith and Chief Operating Officer Edward Stafford to join part of the meeting to discuss a few key topics for the future of leader training. The topics included the future of the MRLCs, awarding PDHs for program sessions, and improving collaboration with the Institutes. The conversations were fruitful and will be valuable as LTC continues to develop its plan for this and future years.

## 2024 PGF and Leader Orientation



On September 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>, nearly 100 members consisting of Section and Branch Presidents, Region Governors, incoming Society Directors, Technical Region Leaders, Committee Members, and Presidential Officers from around the world participated in the 2024 Presidents and Governors Forum (PGF) and Leader Orientation at ASCE Headquarters. This event was hosted by LTC and provided opportunities for attendees to learn about ASCE resources, network with other ASCE leaders, discuss best practices, and develop leadership skills that would benefit their ASCE groups. It was the first time the two programs were held jointly.

The program began with a Welcome and Society Overview by President-elect Feniosky A. Peña-Mora and Executive Director Tom Smith. Following the welcome, the participants were engaged in dynamic leadership and professional development sessions by COL Jim O'Brien, P.E., M.ASCE, and Brock Barry, Ph.D., P.E., F.ASCE—both speakers were highlights of the weekend! Afterwards, our Section and Branch leaders shared successful programs and activities during our Best Practices sessions. ASCE's General Counsel Tara Hoke capped off the day with a presentation on legal issues impacting ASCE's local groups.

On the second day attendees participated in an interactive session with President-elect Peña-Mora, President-elect Elect Marsha Anderson Bomar, and Executive Director Smith, followed by an engaging discussion on Proposed Changes to ASCE Membership from Region 3 Society Director Ken Mika. The day continued with attendees discussing and exchanging Section/Branch Goals, Challenges, and Lessons Learned. The program concluded with some inspiring closing remarks from President-elect Elect Anderson Bomar.

# **Section/Branch Website Support**

If your Section or Branch is experiencing challenges with maintaining its current website, you should consider ASCE's website support program. Over 60 Sections and Branches are currently participating.

The program is intended for Sections and Branches who lack the local resources or time to maintain more complex websites. Participating Sections and Branches will receive a simple template website and basic training on how to update it. The sites use Drupal software and are relatively easy to maintain.
