2019 Presidents and Governors Forum



The 2019 Presidents and Governors Forum (PGF) will be held September 22-23 at ASCE Headquarters in Reston, VA. Sessions will begin early Sunday morning and end Monday mid-afternoon.

A one-day subsidy has been budgeted for one attendee from each Section and Branch in the amount of \$135. We realize this will not cover your airfare or total expenses, but it will hopefully help defray some of your costs.

The PGF is held annually for the benefit and training of Region Governors, Directors, Section and Branch Presidents. One of the main intents is to familiarize local leaders with Society goals, concerns, issues and current programs. The overall purpose of the PGF is to provide a venue for current Section, Branch, and Region leaders to gain the knowledge needed to effectively and efficiently run their local units. This forum provides a summary of various Best Practices developed by Section/Branch leaders, existing tools to effectively run your Section/Branch, how to utilize your Governor, and how to be a better leader. The PGF provides an excellent opportunity for networking with peers, Society leaders, and staff at ASCE Headquarters. A “save the date” was emailed to all Section and Branch Presidents and Region Governors/Directors on April 2. 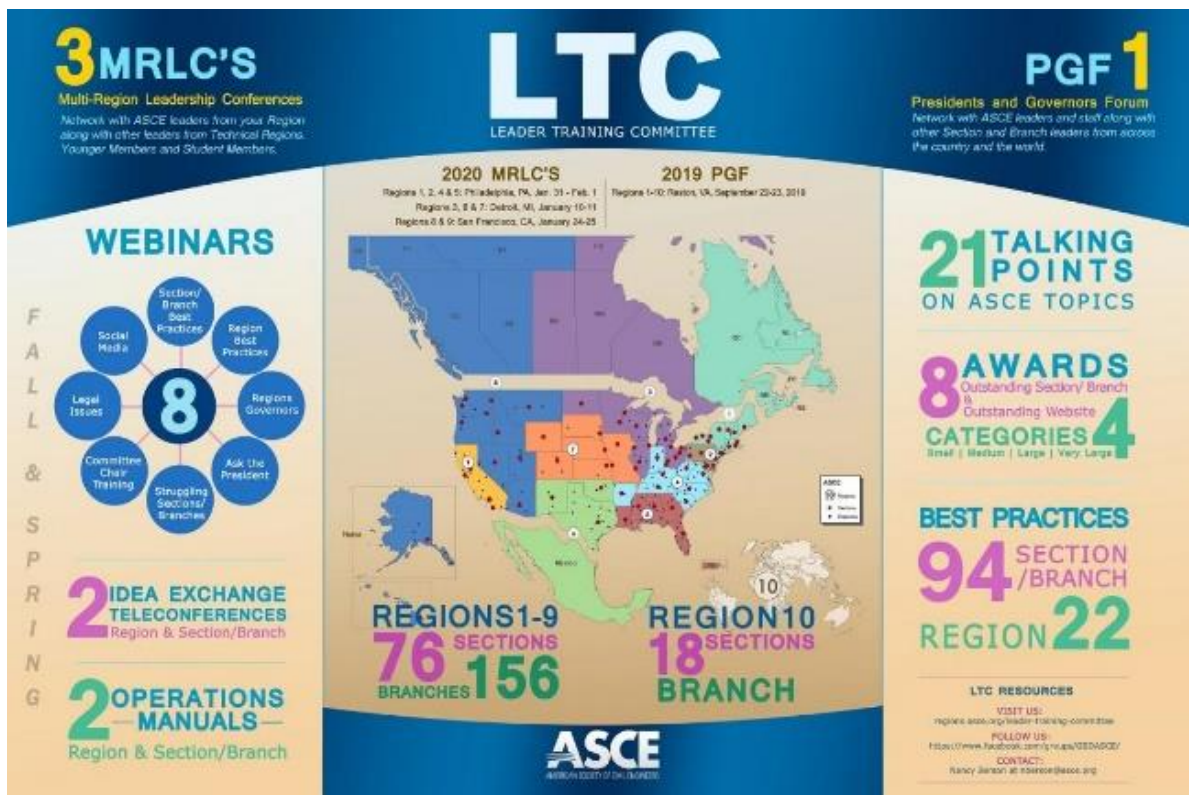
