








#### **Ernesto**

• We are preparing for and stepping into the design of an evolving world where flying cars are already navigating our air space. A pilot program is currently underway in New York, with plans to become permanent




as soon as 2025. Rules are in development stage for flying car air travel, how can our traffic engineers be a part of this conversation?

- Our Region 7 LinkedIn page has 638 followers as I write this, and we'd like to double that in 2025. It is our primary resource


to promote what is happening in and topics important to our Region 7 members. Reach out to your designated Governor to share something your local posts with the Region!
